CONDITIONS FOR OVERNIGHTS ONLY

1. Open to all U.S.T.A. Districts.
2. All races to be one dash. If more than 10 declare in, entries will race in divisions. Each division will race for 1/2 purse money. Money divided 45%, 25%, 15%, 10% and 5%. Six entries to make a race, five must start.
3. All horses must be entered in the name of their owner, lessee, agent, or registered stable name. This association reserves the right to: change the order of the program; decide if races are properly filled; postpone; or declare off any race for any just cause.
4. Starting fee \$25.00 per dash. Drawing time is 10:00 a.m. Draw on Tuesday, August 12 for Thursday's and Friday's races.
5. All horses that have not paid a starting fee will not be allowed to start or remain on the grounds. **No stalls will be used for tack or by the exhibitor for sleeping quarters.** No horses will be allowed on the grounds before Sunday, August 10, 8:00 p.m. Horses must be off the grounds by noon, Saturday, August 16.
6. General Conditions: All times quoted are Central Daylight Savings Time. All reservations or other mail communications should be directed to: Missouri State Fair, Harness Horse Department, 2503 W. 16th St., Sedalia, MO 65301.
7. Telephone calls and entries to be confirmed after 12:00 p.m. Saturday, August 9, 2008. The Harness Horse Racing office at the Fairgrounds will be open between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. from Aug. 11 to Aug. 15. Telephone number is 660-827-8150 extension 8341.
8. For health requirements, refer to the front of this premium book.
9. Missouri-owned horses must be owned 90 days prior to race.
10. All drivers must be in colors while on the track two hours prior to the race time. All drivers will wear clean colors, white pants, and helmets.
11. Camping fees start on date of arrival. For camping fees, refer to the front of this premium book. All exhibitor vehicles will require a vehicle pass starting August 7, 2008. Any person crossing the track and entering the Fairgrounds must purchase an exhibitor pass or pay the daily fee.
12. All horses must have health papers and coggins test.
13. There is a \$10.00 membership fee for the Missouri Trotting Association (per exhibitor). Payment will be required when you get to the Fair.

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION

1. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS EQUIDAE.
 - A. Intrastate (equine in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
 1. Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease. Any equine showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equine will be subject to daily inspection.
 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is not required.
 3. All equine (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or microchip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
 - B. Interstate (equine from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 1. Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease. Any equine showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equine will be subject to daily inspection.
 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required.
 3. All equine (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or microchip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
 4. Alteration or substitution of any information on any VS Form 10-11 including certified photocopy or certified facsimile or any official copy of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall cause the document to be invalid and in violation of sections 267.010 to 267.730, RSMo, and may result in civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per violation and subject to expulsion.
 5. A six (6) - month passport from states with which there is a reciprocal agreement will be accepted in lieu of VS Form 10-11. These passports must have proof of a negative EIA test within thirty (30) days of the date of application of the passport and permanent identification for each horse by means of registered brand, legible tattoo, or microchip to be recorded on the passport and the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart, along with other identifying characteristics. In the event of confirmed vesicular stomatitis in any of the states with which reciprocal agreements exist, use of the six (6) - month passport will be suspended by the state veterinarian of Missouri.
 6. Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyelitis (VEE) vaccination and entry permit is required prior to entry on equine originating from states in which VEE has been diagnosed within the preceding twelve (12) months.
 7. Any equine originating from a premise under quarantine for Vesicular Stomatitis shall obtain an entry permit and must include the statement on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that "the equine listed have not been exposed to Vesicular Stomatitis or located within (10) miles of premises quarantined for Vesicular Stomatitis within the past thirty (30) days".
- C. The board, organization or manager of each assembly or event is responsible for certifying that all equine admitted or participating meet the regulations in this section and shall not admit or allow participation of equine not so certified. Untested equine shall not be allowed to congregate with other equine. The owner of each animal shall comply with requirements under this section 267.010 to 267.730, RSMo, and may be assessed civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each violation.
