SWINE HERDSMAN AWARD

The Missouri State Fair will award two \$75 awards and plaques to the farms with the most outstanding swine exhibits: one for August 11-13, and one for August 14-17. The Swine Herdsman Award for the two sessions of the Missouri State Fair that have purebred breeding stock will be selected according to the following criteria: each exhibitor will be given one ballot at check in time. Exhibitors will nominate and rank three other exhibitors for the Herdsman Award. The ballots will be turned in to the Swine Superintendent's Office by a designated time and the Superintendent will tally the results. Ties will be broken by a committee set up by the Superintendent. The Superintendent will have veto power and if this power is exercised, a committee set up by the Superintendent will select the Swine Herdsman Award winner.

Exhibitors should make their choices on the basis of: 1) cleanliness, grooming, and appearance of exhibits; 2) storage of feed, equipment, etc.; and 3) cooperation, courtesy, and sportsmanship in and out of the show ring. Winners from the previous year will be ineligible to win again for one year. 2007 winners were Karin Bolinger and Carl Stein.

DEDICATION

The 2008 Missouri State Fair Swine Shows are being dedicated to the Will Davis Family. They have been very important to our swine shows and the swine industry. Please join us for the Davis Family dedication on Saturday, August 9.

SHOWMANSHIP RULES AND REGULATIONS

There will be three showmanship sessions, one for each session of the Fair. During the first session, Friday, August 8, at 8:00 a.m., all barrow exhibitors will compete together. During the second session Wednesday, August 13 at 11:00 a.m., the Berkshire, Chester White, Poland, Spots and Tamworth exhibitors will compete together. During the third session Thursday, August 14 at 5:00 p.m., Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, and Crossbred Gilt exhibitors will compete together.

The showmanship classes will be divided as follows: for 4-H there will be classes for these age groups: 8-10; 11-12; 13-15; 16 and up; and for FFA there will be classes for these age groups: 16 and under and 17 and up. For 4-H your age is determined as of January 1 and for FFA your age is the age of the individual on the day of showing.

A plaque will be awarded for each age group. Once an exhibitor has won an age group, they may not compete again until they reach the next age group. There will be a sign-up sheet that junior exhibitors must sign at check-in to be in the showmanship classes.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors must comply with the general rules and regulations and animal health requirements for exhibition in the front of this premium book.
2. No premium will be awarded to only 1 exhibit in a class.
3. All junior and open barrow exhibitors will be required to complete the Pork Quality Assurance III program as per 2/4/2006 guidelines and each exhibitor will be required to show their PQA III card. The exhibitor's name must be on the card. Each exhibitor is required to send a photocopy of their PQA III card along with their entries.

4. All open show breeding animals must be the farrowed property of the exhibitor and shall so appear on the records of the respective breed associations. Exhibitor must have registration certificates on all individual breeding animals and purebred barrows at the Fair. EXCEPTION: Open Junior exhibitors will be allowed to exhibit purchased gilts and barrows as long as they were purchased at least 90 days prior to the show.
5. The age limits for boars and gilts is December 1, 2007 to March 31, 2008 and barrows are January 1 to March 31, 2008. Breeding show animals should weigh at least 180 pounds to show competitively. Classes will be determined after pigs arrive on the grounds. Three classes will be conducted if 40 head or less are entered by sex and breed. Four classes will be conducted if 41 to 79 head are entered by sex and breed. When there are 80 or more head by sex and breed the Superintendent will determine the class breaks. (Gilts may not be shown in any barrow classes.) Barrow weight limits will be 230 to 300 pounds. Barrow classes will be divided equally by weight after all entries are officially weighed. Barrow classes will be posted as soon as possible after weighing. In the open on-foot barrow show the crossbreds will be shown in three (3) divisions. Purebred barrows will be required to show registration certificates.
6. All breeding stock, including purebred and crossbred barrows and gilts, will be required to have recognizable ear notches in both ears, and farrowing date. No scabby or fresh ear notches will be accepted. **(Breed and carcass barrows are required to pre-enter with breeding swine.)**
7. Barrows will be allowed to weigh one time only. All barrows must weigh at least 230 pounds.
8. Entries in swine show close **July 1**. No entries after this date will be accepted. Every exhibitor is required to have a social security number.
9. Exhibitors may enter 10 boars and 10 gilts per breed, and a total of ten (10) barrows; with premiums being paid on all that place in the classes. Exhibitors may enter four (4) barrows per exhibitor in the open Growth & Quality barrow show. 4-H and FFA members may have a total of ten (10) barrows in their respective 4-H or FFA show, but they may only show four (4) in the open Quality & Growth barrow show. Determination of carcass pigs for junior exhibitors must be done by the time of the junior weigh in. Substitution will be allowed as follows: for purebred breeding stock, an animal for an animal within the breed; for crossbred gilts, a gilt for a gilt; and for barrows, a barrow for a barrow.
10. Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Spots and Yorkshire will real-time scan their boars and gilts. The information will be made available to the judge for his placing of the animals. The Missouri Swine Improvement Association will underwrite a portion of the cost of the scan for each exhibitor. The charge for scanning will be \$3 per animal. This money will be due before the animals are scanned. Other breeds will be allowed to scan for their own information on Monday the 11th at a cost of \$5 per head.
11. Exhibitors should not plan to put more than three pigs per pen; two is more desirable.
12. An entry fee of \$6 per head will be charged. Animals will be assigned to pens by the Superintendent.
13. Feed and bedding can be ordered from superintendent's office, or from the truck while at Swine Barn. Check the feed and forage section in the front of this catalog.
14. Exhibitors of purebred/crossbred barrows will not be permitted to bring their animals on the Fairgrounds prior to 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 5, 2008. No purebred breeding stock will be stalled during the barrow portion of the fair.
15. Upon arrival, all exhibitors should check with one of the Assistant Superintendents, at which time health papers and registration certificates will be checked and collected. The swine cards need to be completed and checked against registration papers by the time posted at the Swine Office. Classes will be posted as soon as they are ready. **NOTE: ALL HOGS MUST CHECK IN AT NORTH DOCK BEFORE UNLOADING.**
16. No trucks, trailers or sleeping units will be permitted to park next to the Swine Pavilion, except while loading and unloading. After unloading, park on the campgrounds (trailers north of the Swine Barn. Exit Gate 7, turn left and go to the trailer parking). For further parking information contact the Superintendent of this department. Vehicles found in restricted areas are subject to towing at owner's expense.
17. No hogs that are ineligible to show will be allowed inside the Pavilion for penning.
18. In order that every precaution may be taken to prevent the spreading of diseases, the pens in the Swine Pavilion will be thoroughly disinfected under the supervision of the State Veterinarian.
19. Camping is available in the inner campground for \$25 per space per day, or reserved exhibitor camping is available inside the west public campgrounds adjacent to the tunnel for \$25 per space per day, by reservation only on the camping reservation form.
20. All exhibitors will be expected to keep their pens and area around their pens clean.
21. No powder, oil or artificial whitener will be allowed in grooming hogs.

22. Any party desiring to make a late entry will be able to do so by paying \$25 per head. This can be done up to August 1, 2008.

EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR SWINE IN MISSOURI.

- A. Intrastate (swine in Missouri moving for exhibition only)
 - 1. All swine must be free of clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease.
 - 2. No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required
 - 3. Brucellosis – no test required
 - 4. Pseudorabies – no test required
- B. Interstate (swine from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 - 1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required. All swine must be identified by eartag, ear notch, tattoo and individually listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - 2. Brucellosis –
 - A. Breeding swine originating from brucellosis-free states may exhibit without a brucellosis test.
 - B. Breeding swine originating from a brucellosis stage II states must be tested negative within sixty (60) days prior to exhibition except breeding swine from a validated brucellosis-free herd. The validated herd number and date of last validating test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - 3. Pseudorabies –
 - A. Swine originating from a state classified as Stage V the National Pseudorabies (PRV) Eradication Plan may exhibit without a pseudorabies test.
 - B. All other swine must be tested negative within sixty (60) days prior to exhibition except swine from a qualified pseudorabies-free herd. The qualified herd number and date of last qualifying test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

The **MISSOURI STATE FAIR** will award plaques to the two highest placing junior exhibitors in the Growth and Quality Barrow Classic for all three aspects of the contest (lean gain, on-foot, and meat quality) and overall.

Each purebred breed overall champion and reserve champion barrows will be recognized and receive additional premiums sponsored by the **MISSOURI PORK ASSOCIATION** and **UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI EXTENSION**.

SPECIALS OFFERED

1. **Elanco Animal Health** will sponsor jackets to be awarded to the top three overall winners.
2. **MFA Feed Division** will award \$750 to the Grand Champion and \$500 to the Reserve Grand Champion overall winners of the Growth & Quality Barrow Classic. To qualify, animals must be enrolled in the MFA 4-H/FFA Livestock Premium Program, using one of the MFA recommended feeds. See your authorized MFA Feed supplier for details.

PURPOSE

1. To promote and recognize the pork industry in Missouri.
2. To supply quality carcass evaluation information to producers.
3. To recognize the carcass qualities which the industry desires.
4. To promote the economical performance trait of lean gain per day.

RULES

1. An intent to participate form, including exhibitor name, social security number, address, county, phone number and directions to the farm must be submitted to Loyd Wilson, Missouri Department of Agriculture, P.O. Box 630, Jefferson City, MO 65102, **on or before March 14, 2008**. The completed intent form allows for staff personnel to make arrangements for pig weigh-in. Those who do not submit an intent to participate form will still be allowed to weigh in barrows, but only at specified shows or sales.
2. All barrows must be weighed **on or between April 7-20, 2008**. Weigh-ins will be conducted by University of Missouri staff. Pigs weighed on April 7 can have a **maximum weight of 60 pounds**. For pigs weighed after April 9, add one pound per day resulting in a **maximum weight of 74 pounds** by April 20.
3. All barrows must be ear notched prior to weigh-in using the National Ear Notching System. All barrows will be identified with an official ear tag. Unreadable identification will result in forfeiture of premiums.
4. Each exhibitor may nominate and weigh-in any combination of ten (10) crossbred or purebred barrows.
5. **Each exhibitor may exhibit any combination of a total of four (4) crossbred or purebred barrows at the Missouri State Fair.**
6. Crossbred barrows must be the breeding of two or more breeds.
7. **ADVANCED OR PRE-ENTRY OF ALL OPEN CLASSIC SHOW BARROWS IS REQUIRED.** All barrows entered in the Barrow Classic Contest will require a \$10.00 per head entry fee.
8. **Barrows must meet standard health requirements of the Fair. All barrow exhibitors will be required to complete the National Pork Board Pork Quality Assurance Program or the Missouri Show-Me Quality Assurance Program. Verification of PQA or SMQA will be determined by the local extension staff or FFA advisor at the time of state fair entries are made.**
9. The Missouri State Fair reserves the right to have urine, blood, saliva and/or tissue tests performed on any market animal to detect practices not considered to be normal or usual animal husbandry practices, including the use of anabolic steroids, diuretics, feed additives or drug residues. An exhibitor of an animal producing positive analysis of drugs, unapproved medication or chemical residues, shall be subject to the penalties established by the Missouri State Fair.
10. All medications and feed additives, including Paylean, must be fed according to the product's label.
11. All barrows entered in the Growth and Quality Barrow Classic will be weighed and tattooed on Wednesday, August 6, from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 Noon. **All purebred barrows are required to have registration papers at the scales.**
12. Exhibitors are requested to fill out entry cards including name, social security number, address, zip code, breed and ID number before weighing in barrows.
13. Weigh-in of barrows will be conducted under the supervision of officials from the Missouri Department of Agriculture, Divisions of Ag Business Development and Weights and Measures.
14. All barrows must weigh an absolute minimum of 230 pounds to compete. Barrows weighing over 300 pounds will be eligible to compete, but may be discounted by the processor.
15. All barrows entered in the Growth and Quality Barrow Classic will be evaluated on live and carcass merit and acceptable quality lean pork gain per day on test. All barrows will be scanned for 10th rib fat and loin muscle using ultrasound at time of weigh-in by a certified

technician in cooperation with the University of Missouri and the Missouri Department of Agriculture.

16. All barrows will be shown on Thursday, August 7, at 5:00 p.m. Classes will be divided using adjusted starting weight regardless of breed origin or youth organization. Each barrow will receive a live score.
17. Any exhibitor who removes an animal from competition automatically forfeits his/her entry fee.
18. All barrows will be loaded for processing immediately following the show. Barrows will be processed by Tyson Foods, Columbus Junction, Iowa. Payment for barrows will be mailed directly to exhibitors.
19. **All barrows will be evaluated for carcass quality. Carcass quality will be determined by objective, instrumental evaluation of the cut lean surface of the loin. Whole loins will be collected from each carcass for quality evaluation and transported back to the University of Missouri Meat Laboratory:**
 - ***Color evaluation:** Light intensity (Reflectance) will be obtained with a Minolta colorimeter on the cut lean surface of the loin *longissimus dorsi* muscle.
 - ***Muscle pH:** Muscle pH will be obtained with a Mettler Toledo, glass tipped pH probe by insertion into the loin *longissimus dorsi* muscle.
 - ***Tenderness:** Muscle tenderness will be obtained using Warner-Bratzler Shear Force measurements, which measures the shear force to cut the cooked product, of the loin *longissimus dorsi* muscle.
 - ***Marbling:** Intramuscular fat (marbling) will be obtained using National Pork Board visual fresh pork photographic reference standards of the loin *longissimus dorsi* muscle.

The meat quality portion of the contest will account for 60% of the final score. Each meat quality measurements will represent 15%.
20. Every effort will be made to obtain pork quality data on all carcasses selected. Situations where this may not occur include loss of carcass identity due to skinning off tattoo numbers or illegible tattoos, DOA (dead on arrival), carcass condemnation, retained testicles, or unforeseen situations that may arise.
21. Any carcasses condemned will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
22. An overall ranking will be assigned based on three components: live score is worth 20%, acceptable quality lean pork gain per day on test (containing 5% fat) is worth 20%; and pork quality is worth 60%, which consists of color, pH, tenderness and marbling.
23. A copy of the final results will be mailed to each exhibitor.

Section E SWINE JUDGING CONTEST

The Missouri State Fair Swine Judging Contest is sponsored by the Missouri State Fair in cooperation with the Missouri Pork Association. It will be held Friday, August 8 in the Swine Pavilion.

The contest is open to current 4-H & FFA members that have not yet graduated from high school. There will be two divisions: Junior (eighth grade & under) and Senior (ninth grade & over). Registration for the contest will be Friday, August 8, from 3:00 - 4:00 p.m., in the Swine Pavilion; the contest begins at 5:00 p.m.. Entry fee is \$5.00 per person and will be paid out to the top teams and individuals. Each team must be entered by a sponsor (Agricultural Education instructor or University of Missouri Extension Specialist). A team may have three or four members; only the top three individual scores will determine the team total.

The contest will consist of four (4) swine judging classes and two (2) sets of questions. No oral reasons will be taken. Note: The amount of classes is subject to change.

The Missouri State Fair will provide a first place plaque for the winning team and high individual in each division. The top individuals in each division will receive a cash award. The remainder of the entry fees will be divided among the top three teams in each division.

The results of the contest will be announced as soon as they are available. The results will be posted in the Swine Pavilion the following day. A copy will also be mailed to each coach at the conclusion of the Fair.

BEST OF THE BREEDS JUNIOR CHAMPION BARROW RECOGNITION PROGRAM

GUIDELINES

1. After the two animals are selected for the Sale of Champions, the judge will select a champion of each breed and a crossbred to represent the Best of the Breeds Junior Champion Barrows.

2. These ten barrows are required to be on display for the remainder of the fair. They will be cared for by the Missouri State Fair.
3. The Missouri State Fair may perform urine, saliva and/or tissue tests on all Best of the Breeds Junior Champion Barrow Show animals and reserves the right to test any other exhibited animal to detect practices not considered to be normal or usual animal husbandry practices, including the use of anabolic steroids, diuretics, feed additives or drug residues. An exhibitor or anyone causing an animal to produce a positive analysis of drugs, unproved medication or chemical residues may be subject to penalties established by the Missouri State Fair.
4. Penalties for any person accused of a violation of the rules and regulations governing the Best of the Breeds Junior Champion Barrow Program may result in any or all of the following:
 - A. withhold payment for the animal
 - B. suspension from future exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair
 - C. assessment of any other penalty set by the Director of the Missouri State Fair.
 - D. acceptance of the consequences without recourse against the Missouri State Fair, Missouri Department of Agriculture and the Missouri Pork Association.
5. The Missouri Swine Youth Supporters and MFA Incorporated, Feed Division, 201 Ray Young Drive, Columbia, MO may provide additional premiums for eligible animals that are selected as Junior Champion Breed Barrows. **Contact: Jerry Reid, 660-335-6666 for more information about how to qualify.**
6. Exhibitors are encouraged to solicit donations from their local community. The exhibitor is responsible for the collection of these contributions. Payment for the salvage value of the barrows will be issued at the conclusion of the Fair, after the exhibitor and the animal have met all requirements.

Sale Guidelines:

1. Sale is sponsored by the Missouri Spot Breeders.
 2. Other breeds are welcome to sell. If showing the second day, animal can sell with waiver that the breeder can show the animal before it is released.
 3. Judge, Sale Chairman and Classifier will be responsible for selecting the hogs for the sale and determining the sale order.
 4. 35% of the animals will sell; twice as many gilts will sell as boars.
 5. Sale commission will be 12%. Settlement for full purchase price will be required on every animal at the conclusion of the sale.
 6. Boar stress status needs to be known. If not done, boar will be sold as negative. If buyer tests and if positive or carrier, it is the sellers responsibility. Boars which are positive or carriers will be allowed to sell in the State Fair sale.

SALE GUIDELINES

1. The sale is sponsored by the Missouri Duroc Association, Missouri Hampshire Association and the Missouri Yorkshire Association.
2. All Champion and Reserve Champion boars and gilts are required to go through the sale ring.
3. The number of hogs eligible from each breed for sale will be based on the following formula:

Boars: The Champion boar and Reserve Champion boar will sell plus five percent (5%) of the boars from those breeds which are exhibited at the Missouri State Fair.

Gilts: The Champion Gilt and Reserve Champion Gilt will sell. The number of gilts sold will be based on a 2:1 ratio of the number of boars offered for sale.

4. All animals will sell in their entirety.
5. The judge of each show will be responsible for selecting the hogs to make up the sale order. At the judges' discretion, more hogs may be selected to sell.
6. **Any youth exhibitor who would like to take his/her gilt or boar home to use should not enter the open show. All animals exhibited in the open show are eligible for the sale and if selected must sell.**
