HERDSMAN AWARD

The Missouri State Fair will award a plaque to the herdsman in charge of the most outstanding Dairy Goat exhibit. A committee will make inspections to determine the winner. The following points will be considered: 1) cleanliness, grooming, and appearance of the exhibits; 2) handling of feed, equipment, etc., keeping same out of the alleys; and 3) cooperation, courtesy and sportsmanship in the exhibit area and show ring. The 2016 winner was Angela Kostik.

DEDICATION

The 2017 Missouri State Fair Dairy Goat Shows are being dedicated to a family that has been very important to our Dairy Goat industry in Missouri. Please join us, Sunday, August 20 at 9:30 a.m. in the Sheep Pavilion as we honor them.

Special NOTE to 4-H & FFA exhibitors.

All youth entering in the 4-H and/or FFA Dairy Goat classes need to be sure to read all 4-H & FFA Livestock Rules and Regulations pertaining to Dairy Goats prior to making Open show entries.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All animals must be inspected by State Veterinarian prior to unloading. After inspection, check with superintendent for penning assignments.

1. Exhibitors must comply with all general rules and regulations and animal health requirements for exhibitors in this premium book.
Violation of these rules may result in any or all of the following:
 - A. Withholding or return of payment for the animal or exhibit, premiums and awards.
 - B. Suspension from future exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair for a length of time to be determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission. Suspensions can be for any length of time and may be permanent.
 - C. Probationary exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair for a length of time and under such terms and conditions to be determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission.
 - D. Assessment of any other penalty determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission.

NEW2. Entries must be received by June 30.

NEW3. Any party desiring to make a late entry will be able to do so by paying \$6 late fee per head for the Open Show and \$4 late fee per head for the 4-H/FFA Show, plus the entry fee. This can be done up to July 25, 2017.

4. See general rules and regulations, Show Requirements for goats.
 5. When there is only one (1) exhibit in a class, the exhibitor will receive half of the premium money for the placing awarded by the judge.
 6. The Missouri State Fair does not guarantee premium money, merchandise, prizes or special awards. Because the State Fair Commission is without constitutional or statutory authority to borrow money for its operation, it reserves the right to prorate premium money because of state budget restraints.
 7. All animals shown must have been owned by the exhibitor or must show transfer of ownership to exhibitor by June 30, 2017. Proof of ownership registration certificate and tattoo requirements will be needed. Animals under 6 months of age may be shown with a stamped duplicate of registry, as long as the exhibitor is the one shown on the stamped duplicate. No goat over 6 months of age may be shown with application for registration pending! The exhibitor is that name which appears on the registry certificate.
 8. Junior and Senior does are sanctioned separately. Does shown in one show may not be entered in the other.
 9. All classes entered must be listed on the entry blank.
 10. Substitutions will be allowed within breed, in division at check-in.
 11. Exhibitors are limited to two monies per individual class and 1 money per group class.
 12. Individual animals shown in all of the group and herd classes listed must have been entered and shown in one of the classes for single animals.
 13. Emergency late arrivals must be approved beforehand by Superintendent.
 - NEW 14.** Entry fee is \$6.00 per head for Open Dairy Goats **and** \$4.00 per head for 4-H/FFA Dairy Goats. Superintendent will assign pens. Each exhibitor will receive the number of pens allotted for their number of head entered. Penning will be based on 3 animals per pen. If the exhibitor chooses to pen their animals in tighter quarters than they are allowed, they may use 1 pen for tack.
 15. For information about cleaning, feed, bedding and livestock releases see general rules in this premium book.
 16. In the event that only one exhibitor enters a breed of goats, that breed will be excluded from showing.
 17. Every goat must be properly fitted for show and be provided with a collar. All exhibitors must be neatly and properly dressed (preferably in white) while in the show ring.
 18. Any dairy goat showing evidence of any disease, or any open contagious lesions, or any abscess, will not be allowed to exhibit or show and will be subject to isolation or exclusion depending on the nature and seriousness of the disease or lesion in question. If illness of any nature is suspected in any animal, said animal is subject to examination by the state veterinarian and owner or exhibitor of said animal must abide by the decision of the Veterinarian if found ill.
 19. Refer to Official American Dairy Goat Association rules in regard to Official Shows, Championship leg credits, Registry certificates, tattoos, etc. and carefully review before the Missouri State Fair.
 20. NO MILK OUT required - However, over-distended udders will be discriminated against.
 21. All milk must be disposed of in designated area. No dumping of milk will be allowed in floor drains or outside.
 22. Barns and stalls are for the use of contracted Fairgrounds events only. Absolutely no in-transit or transient animals are allowed. No other species of livestock is permitted in goat pens.
 23. No clipping of animals before 6:00 a.m. and after 9:00 p.m.
 24. For protests see general rules in the front of this premium book.
 25. All goats shown must exhibit well-healed tattoos and must be correctly tattooed. Please check the goats' tattoos at time of application for entry. Tattoos are subject to inspection at any time during show.
 26. Pee Wee Showmanship ages are 3 years and under 6 years; and 6 years and under 8 years.
 27. Premium checks for the Dairy Goat Department will be mailed.
 28. Exhibitors are expected to pay admission fees each day to enter the fair. Discounted tickets are available on entry form.
 29. Obstacle course participants must be Dairy or Kinder Goat exhibitors.
- #### EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR GOATS
- A. Intrastate (goats in Missouri moving for exhibition only)
 1. Goats must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
 2. All goats, regardless of age or gender, must be individually identified by an official scrapie eartag or any other means of permanent identification approved by the state veterinarian and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 3. No test required
 - B. Interstate (goats from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 1. Goats must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease
 2. All goats, regardless of age or gender must be individually identified by an official scrapie eartag or any other means of permanent identification approved by the state veterinarian and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 3. No test required

GROUP RULES AND LIMITATIONS

1. Junior and senior does may be combined in group classes. Does entered in one show cannot be entered in the other.
2. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family, a family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, all entries from that farm and herd may be considered as that of a single exhibitor in all group classes.
3. Exhibitors are limited to 1 money per group class.
4. Junior Get-of-Sire: Three junior does, the get of one sire, dry yearlings or younger. One entry by the same sire per exhibitor.
5. Senior Dam and Daughter: Daughter does not need to be in milk.
6. Senior Get-of-Sire: Three does, the get of one sire, all to be in milk. One entry by the same sire per exhibitor.
7. Senior Produce of Dam: Two does, the produce of one dam, all to be in milk. One entry by the same dam per exhibitor.
8. Breeders Generation Class: Three does, the first being the grand-dam, then the dam and then the dam's daughter. All must be in milk, with the exception of the daughter, who may be but does not need to be in milk. All must be bred and owned by the exhibitor.
9. Dairy Herd: Four does all of one breed, and all in milk. One group per breed per exhibitor and owned by exhibitor.

 - A. Withholding or return of payment for the animal or exhibit, premiums and awards.
 - B. Suspension from future exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair for a length of time to be determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission. Suspensions can be for any length of time and may be permanent.
 - C. Probationary exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair for a length of time and under such terms and conditions to be determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission.
 - D. Assessment of any other penalty determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission.
2. All animals shown must have been owned by the exhibitor since June 30, 2017.
3. August 16, 2017, is the cut-off date for the age of the animal.
4. Entries close June 30. Exhibitors are limited to two (2) placings per class, although entries are not limited.
5. All classes entered must be shown on entry blank.
6. Substitutions will be allowed within the class only.
7. Entry fee is \$6.00 per head for Open Kinder Goats and \$4.00 per head for 4-H/FFA Kinder Goats. Pens will be assigned by Superintendent. Check with Superintendent upon arrival before unloading.
8. A registration certificate is required for any animal entered as registered and proof of this registration must be presented to the superintendent before the animal is shown. If the registration papers are pending at the time of entering the show, proof of registration must be given to the Superintendent before the animal is shown.
9. Animals will be hand held or led by a rope and/or halter. Exhibitors are requested to be neatly attired when showing their animals in the ring.
10. Any Kinder goat showing evidence of any disease, any open contagious lesions, or any abscess, will not be allowed to exhibit or show and will be subject to isolation or exclusion depending on the nature and seriousness of the disease or lesion in question. If illness of any nature is suspected in any animal, said animal is subject to examination by the state veterinarian and owner or exhibitor of said animal must abide by the decision of the veterinarian if found ill. All exhibitors must comply with animal health regulations in the front of this premium book.
11. Barns and stalls are for the use of contracted Fairgrounds events only. Absolutely no in-transit or transient animals are allowed. No other breed of livestock is permitted in goat pens.
12. See general rules and regulations, Show Requirements for goats, in reference to the number of head needing to be shown to maintain this show.
13. When there is only one (1) exhibit in a class, the exhibitor will receive half of the premium money for the placing awarded by the judge.
