<u>4-H is Department 19 and FFA is Department 29</u> <u>4-H AND FFA SWINE REGULATIONS</u>

- 1. Each animal must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and registration certificates must be filed with the superintendent of the department as soon as possible after arrival. Animals not meeting breed association standards will be subject to disqualification. Exhibitors whose registration papers do not show the date of animal ownership transfer must have a letter from the breed association verifying the date of ownership transfer.
- 2. Boars must have farrowed on the home farm of the exhibitor from sows owned by the exhibitor at the time of farrowing and earmarked at farrowing time. Registration papers will be checked. Gilts must have been owned at least 90 days before the Fair. Date of purchase must be indicated on the registration certificate or exhibitor should have a letter from the breed association verifying the date of ownership.
- 3. Swine must be pre-entered in the show by July 8 on forms provided at the University Extension centers or from vocational agriculture instructors. All barrows must have been owned for at least 90 days and may be purebred or crossbred. Barrows must have been farrowed on or after December 1, 2024. No minimum or maximum

weight is required for 4-H or FFA barrow shows. With 15 pound Note weigh back allowance. Purebred barrows must have registration papers.

- 4. All barrows, including crossbred, will be required to have recognizable ear notches and farrowing dates. Fresh ear notches will not be accepted.
- Exhibitors will be limited to ten (10) boars, ten (10) gilts per breed and a total of ten (10) barrows. Each individual may exhibit a maximum of ten (10) crossbred gilts and ten (10) crossbred boars. Gilts must be from a breed currently showing in either the first or second half of the swine shows.
- 6. After the two barrows are selected for the Sale of Champions, the judge will select a champion of each breed and a crossbred to represent the Junior Barrow Show Best of Breeds Champions. These barrows are not eligible for the Open Barrow Show (excluding the (4) overall champion and reserve champion 4-H and FFA barrows, all other Junior Barrow Show Best of Breed Champions may be released following the conclusion of the open barrow show).
- 7. See general regulations in the front of the premium book and general regulations for this department in regard to feed, bedding, and health standards.
- 8. Pellet bedding and sawdust is prohibited in the pens. No bedding materials are allowed in alleyways.
- 9. 2 animals will assigned to pens in the east barn, bring dividers if **NOTE** needed. Exception is for Boars.
- 10. Commercial gilt class will be shown by weight rather than by age.
- 11. To facilitate the FFA and 4-H crossbred show, two rings will be utilized. FFA will show in one ring and 4-H will show in the other; the show will be concurrent.

DNA Validation - Ownership of Animals:

All individual market barrows entered for competition must have been owned solely by the exhibitor by May 1, 2025. A DNA hair sample must have been mailed to the Missouri State Fair, postmarked by May 15, 2025. for each market barrow entered. Animal identification (registration ear notch/NUES tag) must be included on the DNA sample envelope. DNA samples submitted to the Missouri State Fair on all junior market barrows become the property to the Missouri State Fair on all junior market barrows become the property of the Missouri State Fair. Exhibitors relinquish any claim to said samples when submitted as proof of ownership. DNA hair samples are stored in a secure environment at the Missouri State Fair and are destroyed in due time following the show. These samples will never be made available for cloning or any like procedure. In all market barrows at the Missouri State Fair, any DNA samples that have been harvested (collected) prior to the Sale of Champions Auction (with the exception of the DNA samples submitted to the Missouri State Fair as proof of ownership as stated above) will be considered to be the property of the exhibitor to use at their discretion. Exhibitors will not be allowed to harvest any samples after the transfer of ownership via the "fall of the hammer" at the Sale of Champions Auction unless agreed upon in writing between the buyer and the seller.

4-H & FFA Swine Judging Contest

Thursday, August 14 at 12:00 in the North Ring of the Swine Pavilion The 4-H and FFA Swing Judging Contest is sponsored by the Missouri State Fair in cooperation with the Missouri Pork Association.

The competition is open to all Missouri youth ages 5-21. There will be four divisions: Novice (ages 5-8), Junior (ages 9-13), Senior (ages 14-18), and Pro (ages 19-21). Registration for the contest will be from 10:00 -11:00 a.m., in the Swine Pavilion with the contest begins at 12:00 p.m. Entry fees are \$5.00 per person. Each team must be entered by a sponsor (Agricultural Education instructor or University of Missouri Extension Specialist). A team may have three (3) or four (4) members: only the top three (3) individual scores will determine the team total. Individuals are also able to enter as a single contestant.

The contest will consist of four (4) swine judging classes and two (2) sets of questions. No oral reasons will be taken. Note: The amount of classes is subject to change.

The first-place individual and the first-place team in each division will be awarded.

The results of the contest will be announced and posted in the Swine Pavilion as soon as they are available. These will be displayed no later than the following day. A copy of the results will also be mailed to each coach at the conclusion of the Missouri State Fair.

Swine Skillathon

- August 7, 9:00 am to 12:00 noon, North Arena Swine Barn
- 1. All swine exhibitors (4-H and FFA) may compete in the Swine Skillathon.
- 2. Youth will compete in three age divisions: 12 and under; 13-15; and 16 and over.
- 3. Once a participant has won a respective age division, they are ineligible to compete again in that age group, but may move up to the next age division.
- The Skillathon consists of three different areas:
 - a) A hands-on, swine management test, including identification of feed ingredients, equipment, and cuts of meat; ear-notches and medication protocols; calculating growth performance; and other technical skills.
 - b) A computerized quiz covering current events and production issues in the swine industry.
 - A personal interview Five to ten minute interview with MU c) Extension staff or industry representatives. Scores will be based on understanding of the importance of the industry, ability to communicate ideas, and the ability to take a proactive stance on issues related to pork production.
- 5. Prize money and plaques will be awarded after the competition at 1:00 p.m. in the North Swine Arena of the Swine Barn.

SHOWMANSHIP RULES AND REGULATIONS

There will be three showmanship sessions, one for each session of the Fair. During the first session, all barrow exhibitors will compete together. During the second session, the Berkshire, Chester White, Poland, Spots and Other Purebred exhibitors will compete together. During the third session, Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, and crossbred gilt exhibitors will compete together. - An award for herdsmanship is being offered to give recognition to swine exhibitor groups who have outstanding exhibits.
- FFA chapters and 4-H counties will award a plaque to the top-rank-
- ing chapter and county. Exhibitors in the swine division are requested to maintain their pen area(s) as orderly as possible. Exhibitors must keep their part of the 3. building neat and attractive in appearance.
- Exhibits may be judged several times daily. Awards will be made Sunday at the youth appreciation barbecue.
- 5. Exhibitors desiring to be penned together must specify on their entry form when they pre-enter their swine. BASIS FOR RATING SWINE EXHIBITS

- 1. Cleanliness of Alleys and Pens: Bedding must be adequate, dry, clean and in place. Manure removed and deposited in proper place. Alleys swept clean, free of dust and straw. (50 points)
- Arrangement of Exhibit: Hay, chips and straw arranged neatly and orderly. Feed and pans, miscellaneous gear arranged in an orderly and uniform manner. (15 points)
- Appearance of Hogs: Hogs clean and brushed. (10 points)
- Signs and Stall Cards: Uniform, readable from alley, clean and complete with FFA chapter or 4-H club name. (15 points)
- Attendants: Courtesy of the attendant(s) and others in the area, at the wash rack, showring, etc. Promptness on entering the showring. (20 points)

Nonessential equipment or materials in excess of needs for the show period will not be considered in the rating.

Purina Animal Nutrition will provide \$1,000 cash award to the Overall Grand Champion Market Swine, and \$500 cash award to the Overall Reserve Grand Champion Market Swine, if animals were fed using the Purina Honor Show Chow Feed Program. Minimum feeding requirement is the same as the ownership rules stated in the Premium Guide.

(Dark colored is any animal with black hair or skin.)

Gilts and boars born after December 1, 2024, and barrows born after December 1, 2024 will be eligible to show in the 2025 Missouri State Fair. Breeding classes will be determined after pigs arrive on the Fairgrounds. Four classes will be conducted by sex and breed if 79 head or less are entered, and five classes will be conducted by sex and breed if 80 head or more are entered.

4-H swine project members are required to have a current card in Youth Pork Quality Assurance or Missouri Show Me Quality Assurance. No further quality assurance documentation is needed with the State Fair entry

All Berkshire swine must be registered by the American Berkshire As-sociation (ABA), PO Box 2436, 1769 US 52 West, West Lafayette, IN 47996. Said registration paper must be presented at time of check-in. The ABA is the only Berkshire swine registry recognized by the National Association of Swine Records (NASR) and the National Pedigreed Livestock Council (NPLC).
