BEEF CATTLE HERDSMAN AWARD

The Missouri State Fair will award two \$80 awards, plus attractive plaques, to the herdsmen in charge of the two most outstanding beef cattle exhibits. A committee will make inspections to determine the winners. The following points will be considered: 1) cleanliness, grooming, and appearance of the exhibits; 2) handling of feed, equipment, etc. and keeping same out of the alleys; and 3) cooperation, courtesy, and sportsmanship in the exhibit area

The 2022 Beef Cattle Herdsman award was presented to Rocking F Polled Hereford and Circle S Shorthorn.

Best-Kept Beef Cattle Exhibit Barn

The Missouri State Fair will award a plaque, to be hung in the Beef Cattle Office, to the breed that has demonstrated and presented its entire exhibit barn and is considered by the committee to be the best-kept barn during the course of the Fair. The following points will be considered: 1) cleanliness, grooming, and appearance of the exhibits; 2) handling of feed, equipment, etc. and keeping same out of the alleys; and 3) cooperation, courtesy, and sportsmanship in the exhibit area and show ring.

The Best-Kept Beef Cattle Exhibit Barn in 2022 was Gelbvieh and Santa

Gertrudis.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

NoteAll exhibitors, except beef cattle, must bring their own bedding during the Note 2023 Fair. Livestock exhibitors are also expected to bring their own feed -

additional feed and bedding will not be available for purchase during the Fair. Beef cattle exhibitors will be provided Premium Missouri Mulch bedding for \$10 per head to be paid along with entries. No other bedding will be allowed for beef cattle including sawdust, pellets, etc. Dairy cattle exhibitors may continue adding straw to the bedding. All exhibitors should practice good environmental stewardship, keeping the bedding clean and free of glass, plastics, cans and other trash for the purposes of the Fair's recycling

- Exhibitors must comply with all general rules and regulations and animal health requirements for exhibitors in this premium book.
 - Violation of these rules may result in any or all of the following:
 - A. Withholding or return of payment for the animal or exhibit, premiums and awards.
 - B. Suspension from future exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair for a length of time to be determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission. Suspensions can be for any length of time and may be permanent.
 - C. Probationary exhibiting at the Missouri State Fair for a length of time and under such terms and conditions to be determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission.
 - D. Assessment of any other penalty determined by the Missouri State Fair Commission or the Director of the Missouri State Fair on behalf of the Commission.
- All entries must be received by July 3.
- When there is only one (1) exhibit in a class, the exhibitor will receive half of the premium money for the placing awarded by the judge.
- The Missouri State Fair does not guarantee premium money, merchandise, prizes or special awards. Because the State Fair Commission is without constitutional or statutory authority to borrow money for its operation, it reserves the right to prorate premium money because of state budget restraints.
- All group classes must be pre-entered by July 3 in order to show. Individual animals shown in all of the group and herd classes listed must have been entered and shown in one of the classes for single animals. This includes Junior breeding cattle. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Entry fee for 4-H/FFA Breeding Beef Cattle will be \$11.00 per head, DOES NOT enter the juniors into the Open show; **OPEN Breeding Beef Cattle** will be \$20.00 per head. Entry fee for **4-H/FFA Steers**, **4-H/FFA Market Heifers and Crossbred Heifers** will be \$15.00 per head. The Missouri State Fair will provide bedding in the barn for all beef cattle exhibits. Bedding will not be furnished for the tie-out area.

- 7. Any party desiring to make a late entry will be able to do so by paying \$20 per head for Open Breeding Beef Cattle and \$11 per head for 4-H/ FFA Breeding Beef Cattle; and \$25 per head for Open Carcass Steers; and \$15.00 per head for 4-H/FFA Steers, 4-H/FFA Market Heifers and Crossbred Heifers, along with the entry fee. This can be done up to July 25, 2023.
- Any herd owners desiring to come on grounds or set up their stalls before the arrival date, as stated in the catalog, must check with the Beef Cattle Superintendent. If an exhibitor plans to request an "early release" in order to show at another fair, it will be necessary to have a copy of the entry in that fair, or a letter from the fair stating that the exhibitor has made an entry with them.
- Application for entry in purebred classes must show registry numbers of each animal entered. No application will be accepted until this information is received.
- Substitutions will be allowed on the basis of a heifer for a heifer and a bull for a bull, regardless of age within a breed, per exhibitor.
- All display or Exhibit beef breeds will be under the supervision of the Beef Superintendent and must remain on exhibition throughout the entire fair. There will be \$20.00 charge per head.
- All money is offered only in open competition. No exhibitor will be permitted to make more than two entries in any one class.
- All livestock exhibitors may purchase exhibitor passes according to the fee schedule in the front of this book. Remittance for passes must be sent with entry.
- Stalls, feed and bedding information may be found in the general rules of this catalog. Superintendents will not require feed releases.

 15. Any stalls not used by exhibitor but paid for by the exhibitor will be
- forfeited to be used at the discretion of the Beef Cattle Superintendent for stalling of other cattle. Any refund requests must be received prior
- Stalls are for cattle only. No feed or tack may be stored in stalls.
- All beef cattle exhibitors should enter GATE 4.
- No trucks or trailers will be permitted to park behind the beef barns except while loading and unloading. After unloading, livestock trailers may park in Restricted LotA, west of Gate 4. Vehicles found in restricted areas without the proper hang tags are subject to towing at owner's
- 19. Beef tie-out gates will be closed daily at 8 a.m. and opened at 7 p.m. Cattle may be led to tie-out areas after 7:00 p.m. and must be returned to stalls by 8:00 a.m. Any cattle remaining in the tie-out area after 8 a.m. will not be allowed to enter the grounds.
- The tie-out area will open August 6 at noon for Angus, Charolais, Gelbvieh, Hereford, Simmental and exhibition cattle. No space may be reserved for any other breed, steers, market heifers or crossbred heifers, prior to August 12. Any exhibitor doing so will be disqualified from exhibiting with no refund and will be ineligible to exhibit at the 2023 Missouri State Fair.
- Limited exhibitor camping is available by reservation. The tie-out area will open August 6 at noon.
- All cattle must be in their respective places on the arrival date as stated in catalog.
- All health papers are to be delivered to the Beef Cattle Superintendent at times designated.
- No grooming chutes will be allowed in the show barns except on show day.
- No power washers will be allowed on wash rack.
- Fans: All fans will be pointed in the direction indicated by arrows on the wall or stall.
- No Port-a-cool units allowed on the Missouri State Fairgrounds. Only self-contained misters will be permitted on the fairgrounds.
- No artificial filling of any cattle will be allowed on the Missouri State Fairgrounds. No pumps will be allowed on the Missouri State Fairgrounds. Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.
- 29. There are to be no nurse cows on the fairgrounds.
 30. ALL BULLS 1 YEAR OF AGE AND OLDER MUST SHOW WITH A NOSE LEAD. Entry into the show ring without one will be an automatic disqualification. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the Beef Cattle Superintendent and Staff.
- 31. There will be no dogs allowed in any barns **whether** on a leash or in a cage. There will be NO exceptions.
- 32. Failure to comply with the above regulations will result in the forfeiture of any or all premiums won.
- 33. When 9 or more head entered and checked into any single class, the class shall be split, as determined, by age, by the Beef Cattle Superintendent and staff.

Exhibition requirements for cattle, bison, and exotic bovids

- Intrastate (cattle in Missouri moving within Missouri for exhibition
 - No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required.
 - b. All cattle must be free of clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease
 - Brucellosis no test or vaccination is required.
 - Tuberculosis no test is required.
- 2. Interstate (cattle from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 - A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required and all livestock must be individually identified by official ear tag or tattoo and individually listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

- b. Brucellosis
 - Cattle from Brucellosis-Free States
 - All sexually intact cattle may enter without a brucellosis
 - Steers. No brucellosis test required but must be individually identified and listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - ii. Sexually intact cattle from brucellosis Class A states
 - All test eligible animals must be tested negative for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, except
 - Cattle from a certified brucellosis-free herd. The certified herd number and the date of the last test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection;
 - Steers. No brucellosis test required but must be individually identified and listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; and
 - Rodeo bulls from a Class A state than must have a negative brucellosis test within twelve (12) months prior to exhibition.
- c. Tuberculosis
 - Beef cattle from Tuberculosis-Free states
 - All beef cattle two (2) months of age and over (including steers) may enter without additional testing requirements or entry permit.
 - ii. Beef cattle from Tuberculosis Status-less than free states. must meet the following requirements:
 - Must obtain an entry permit.
 - Must have a negative tuberculosis test within sixty (60) days prior to shipment, and the test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; or
 - Move from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd (herd test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspe-
 - Move directly from a herd of origin that has had one (1) complete negative herd test within one (1) year (date of herd test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection).

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Approved Santa Gertrudis Open and Junior Shows

- 1. All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered or recorded (50% - 75% with one parent a registered Santa Gertrudis), meeting the requirements for registration or recordation as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis Rules and Regulations for Registration, and shall be governed by the last revised version of the Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open & Junior Shows as approved by the board of Santa Gertrudis Breeders International, PO Box 1257, Kingsville, Texas 78364. A copy may be obtained by contacting the association or viewed at www. santagertrudis.com.
- Each owner must be a bona fide member of SGBI. No outstanding balances on an active or junior members account.
- ALL animals accepted for exhibition in an SGBI sanctioned show are subject to inspection at each show between arrival on grounds and prior to entering the show ring. The inspection will be conducted by a committee comprised of two (2) members of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and one (1) from the Breed Standards Committee.
- 4. Heifers 24 months of age or older must be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian or have produced a live, Santa Gertrudis sired calf with that calf at the side, meeting the Standard of Excellence and the calf must be registered by 30 days of age. If animal is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, this fact must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician in order to show.
- All bulls classes 12 months of age or older must have a nose lead for show purposes.
- All animals must be registered or recorded and PERMANENTLY identified before the show with a brand ID or and ear tattoo.
- 7. To be eligible to compete in SGBI approved junior shows, animal(s) must be registered or recorded in the name of the junior member. This registered or recorded junior must feed, fit, care for, and show the animal entered. Ownership deadline is April 1 for all animals born January 1 of the preceding year and thereafter, and November 1 for all other animals.
- 8. a) All purebred animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show.

Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick, head clipped smooth; underline clipped blending sides; udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder; ears clipped as to environmental and local standards; neck and brisket clipped; body clip using common sense as to season; leg hair clipped and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof; tailhead clipped; pull switch or brush out (no ball, etc.) trim tail to personal preference

- b) Star Five exhibits are not subject to purebred clipping rules. Entries are to be fitted blow and go. Hair may be brushed according to preference with no foreign substance/fitting materials on any part of the body.
- 9. Each animal exhibited must be exhibited with the correct age and shown
- in the class corresponding with their correct age.

 10. Entries in each class will be placed 1, 2, 3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
- 11. Polled classes will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show. Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals must be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence of horny tissue.
- 12. Classes with over thirty (30) entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
- 13. Dress for exhibitors participating in SĞBI sanctioned Open and Junior shows shall be of neat and clean clothing of collared shirts with sleeves, belts, no midriffs showing and appropriate footwear - no tennis shoes. Exhibitors may wear hats or go bareheaded -- no caps.
- 14. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Additionally, no pumping or filling of an animal with a liquid, air, diuretic or any other substance is allowed. ALL animals and exhibitors found to be in violation of this rule will be banned for life from showing at SGBI approved shows.
- 15. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship paper.
- 16. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his/her entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by him/her to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair, and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee/representative as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse, against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.
- For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgments, either past, present or future, arising from or connected with the administration of use of such test or examination and the resulting decision therefrom.
- 18. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his/her animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association. This refers to, but is not limited to, the procedures to file protest and appeals process
- 19. RULES FOR HIGH POINT AWARDS:
 - a. For each point show, first place class winner will receive 2 points; second place class winner receives 1 point, Division Champion receives 3 points; Reserve Division Champion receives 2 points; Grand Champion receives 5 points and Reserve Grand Champion receives 4 points; Best of Polled receives 1 point but does not count toward overall points.
 - b. Get of Sire and Produce of Dam points go toward Exhibitor/Breeder of the Year Awards.
 - c. Points will stay with animal if sold.
 - d. The Sire and Dam of the Year should have points from at least two (2) different offspring.
 - e. All points earned at the National Open Show are to be doubled.
- 25. DNA Testing SGBI and its representatives have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification, pedigree of exhibited animals, and parentage verification of Star 5, including calves exhibited at the side of any female. "Said authority shall extend to and cover the enforcement of all show rules as adopted by SGBI.
